

12.1.1 To confirm the minutes of the 11th Meeting of the Senate held 31st December 2004 and the urgent meetings held on 01.02.2005 and 28.03.2005.

The minutes of the 11th Meeting of the Senate held on 31st December 2004 and the urgent meetings held on 1st February 2005 and 28.03.2005 were confirmed with the following modification in the minutes of the 11th Meeting:

Item No. 11.2.3

To consider registration of Ph.D. candidates and the eligibility requirement in IIC.

The proposal of the IIC was not accepted. However, arising out of the discussion, the Senate decided that a proposal for Joint Faculty/Joint Professors in cognate

Departments for faculty members who are working in Academic Service Centre may be prepared.

- 12.1.2 To receive a report on the actions taken to implement the decisions taken by the Senate in its 11th Meeting of the Senate held 31st December 2004 and the urgent meetings held on 01.02.2005 and 28.03.2005.**

The Senate noted the actions taken on the decisions taken by the Senate in its 11th Meeting held on 31st December 2004 and the urgent meetings held on 01.02.2005 and 28.03.2005.

ITEMS FOR CONSIDERATION:

- 12.2.1 To consider the "Vision", "Mission" and "Core Values" Statements**

The Senate considered the proposed "Vision", "Mission" and "Core Values" statements and decided that:-

- (a) The "**Vision**" be modified to read as under:

"Vision"- To be the fountainhead of new ideas and innovations in science and technology and continue to be a source of pride for all Indians.

- (b) The "**Mission**" as stated by Mr. Subodh Bhargava being more comprehensive was accepted in principle. It was decided that a three-member committee comprising of Professors N.K.Mehta, Ravi Bhushan and D.K.Nauriyal to marginally modify the "Mission Statement", as per the suggestions made on the floor of the House and place the same before the Chairman, Senate for approval, on behalf of the Senate.

- (c) The "**Core Values**" be modified to read as under:

- Academic integrity and accountability
- Respect and tolerance for the views of every individual
- Attention to issues of national relevance as well as of global concern

- Holistic understanding, including knowledge of the human sciences
- Appreciation of intellectual excellence and creativity
- An unfettered spirit of learning, exploration, rationality and enterprise
- Sensitivity to social responsibilities

12.2.2 To Consider a Proposal to establish a Centre of Transportation Systems (CoTS) at IIT Roorkee

At the outset, Prof. S.P.Gupta, Professor-in-Charge Planning briefed the Senate about the proposal to establish a Centre for Transportation Systems at IIT Roorkee and highlighted the salient features of the Concept Paper prepared by the designated Committee. After discussion, the Senate accepted the Concept Paper as the base document for further deliberation and also made the under-mentioned observations:

1. More areas involving the Mechanical & Industrial Engineering Department be included.
2. Civil Engineering Centric Transportation Engineering subjects be excluded from the activities of the proposed Centre, as these are already being handled by the Civil Engineering Department.
3. Inland water transport be included in the proposed activities of the Centre.
4. A Centre for Transportation Systems, which will be multidisciplinary in nature, inclusive all areas of Science, Technology, Management and Humanities, be conceptually accepted for further deliberation/ debate on the subject.

12.2.3 To consider a revision in the minimum qualifications of candidates for admission to PG/M.Tech. in IWM (WRD&M).

The Senate resolved that as recommended by the Board PGS&R, the revised minimum qualification of candidates for admission to PG Diploma/M.Tech. in Irrigation Water Management (WRD&M) be approved as under:

“Bachelor’s Degree in Civil Engg. or equivalent/Agricultural Engg. or M.Sc. Agriculture in Agronomy, Soil Science, Agrometerology with Mathematics as one of the papers at the level of B.Sc./B.Sc. Agriculture”.

These qualifications would be applicable from the academic session 2006-07.

12.2.4 To consider a revision in the minimum qualifications of candidates for admission in M. Tech. (Pulp & Paper)

The Senate resolved that as recommended by the Board PGS&R, the revised minimum qualifications of candidates for admission to M.Tech. (Pulp & Paper) be approved as under:

B.Tech./B.E. Degree in Pulp & Paper Engg./Chemical Engg./ Mechanical Engg./ Polymer Engg. / Cellulose Technology or its equivalent.

OR

Post B.Sc. two years’ Institute/University/IPT Diploma (equivalent to M.Sc. degree) in Pulp & Paper or its equivalent with a minimum of two years’ relevant experience in Industry/Research organizations.

These qualifications would be applicable from the academic session 2006-07.

12.2.5 To consider the requirements for Admission to Ph.D. programme in the Civil Engg. Department

The Senate resolved that as recommended by the Board PGS&R, the proposed eligibility requirements for admission to the Ph.D. programme in the Civil Engineering Department be approved as under:

- (i) B.Tech. / M.Tech. or equivalent degree in Civil Engineering. Candidates having an M.Tech. Degree but not having a Bachelor's degree in Engineering must have studied Mathematics at the Bachelors level.
- (ii) B. Tech./M.Tech. degree in any branch of Engineering may be considered for research areas consistent with the academic background and experience.
- (iii) M.Sc. Degree in any branch of Science or MCA (with mathematics at the Bachelors level for both M.Sc. and MCA) may also be considered for research areas in Geomatics Engineering.

These qualifications would be applicable from the academic session 2006-07.

12.2.6 To consider the syllabus of a 4 credit elective course, CY 772: Analysis of Industrial Polymers in M. Tech. (Chemistry).

After discussion, the Senate decided as under:-

1. The relevant IS Code be used for the book references.
2. The matter be referred back to the Department for re-examination of the practical component, and changing the course to a L:3, T:0, P:2 structure.
3. The suggestions made by the Senators on the floor, be incorporated by the Department in the proposed syllabus, and put up to the Chairman, Senate for approval, on behalf of the Senate.

12.2.7 To consider the Academic Calendar for the Autumn Semester of the session 2005-06 (June 28, 2005 to January 03, 2006)

After discussion, the Senate approved the Academic Calendar for the Autumn Semester of the session 2005-06 (28th June, 2005 to 3rd January, 2006) with some minor modifications. The modified Academic Calendar is given at **Appendix 'A'**.

12.2.8 To consider the revised Teaching Scheme for M. Tech. Geomatics Engineering, Geotechnical Engineering and Geotechnical Engineering with diversification to Rock Mechanics and the detailed syllabi of revised and new courses.

After discussion, the Senate decided that only the revised Teaching Scheme for M.Tech. (Geomatics Engineering) as given in the agenda note be approved. Further, the remaining revised teaching schemes be referred back to the Department for re-examination in the light of discussions held on the floor, and brought before the Senate for re-consideration.

12.2.9: To consider the Teaching Scheme and Syllabus of the new M.Tech.(CAD, CAM and Robotics) course and the revised course structure along with the detailed syllabi of different existing courses in the Mechanical and Industrial Engg. Deptt.

After discussion the Senate decided as under:

1. The Academic Curriculum for the first semester of the M.Tech. (CAD, CAM and Robotics) course, be approved with the observation that the practical component should be increased where necessary.
2. The course structure for the first semester for the four remaining M.Tech. Courses be also approved with the observation that the suggestions for improvement of all the first semester courses, if any, be sent to the Mechanical & Industrial Engineering Department for consideration and incorporation.

3. The Chairman, Senate may approve the Academic Curriculum for the first semester, after the suggestions received from the senators, are duly incorporated.
4. The remaining revised teaching schemes be referred back to the Department for re-examination in the light of the discussions held on the floor and brought before the Senate for re-consideration.

12.2.10 To consider the draft of the Senate Manual of IIT Roorkee as recommended by the Executive Committee of the Senate (ECS).

The issue be deferred for consideration in the next meeting of the Senate.

12.2.11 To consider the proposal of Department of Humanities & Social Sciences to introduce the Institute Elective IHS-36: Sanskrit Language.

After discussion, the Senate decided that the idea for introduction of a course of Sanskrit Language in the Department of Humanities and Social Sciences be accepted in principle. However, a more comprehensive course structure, which links Sanskrit to Artificial Intelligence and Computing, should be framed and brought before the Senate for re-consideration.

12.2.12 To consider the Institute Fees to be charged from the students who register for a "Self Study Course" during the summer semester.

As considered and recommended by the Board, UGS in its meeting held on 23.2.2005, the Senate decided that the Institute Fee to be charged from the students who register for a "Self Study Course" in the summer term will be at the rate of Rs. 750/- per credit.

12.2.13 To consider the issue regarding changeover from the four year B.Tech. Programme to the Dual Degree Programme.

As considered and recommended by the Board, UGS in its meeting held on 23.2.2005, the Senate decided that a changeover from the B.Tech. to the Dual degree Programme

may take place at the end of 5th Semester, provided that the concerned student has a CGPA which is ≥ 6.5 with no backlog. Further, the present provision for allowing a changeover from the IDD programme to the B.Tech programmes at the end of first year be discontinued. Regulation No. 13.2 for the IDD programme stands modified as under:

Regulation No. 13.2:

"A student enrolled for IDD through Joint Entrance Examination carried out by JEE, shall be eligible for change of branch in IDD programme at the end of first year provided that he/she satisfies the following criteria:

- (i) CGPA for general category ≥ 7.5
- (ii) CGPA for SC/ST category students ≥ 6.5
- (iii) Earned credits at the end of first year $\geq 50^*$

* The credits for NCC/ NSS/NSO/Rangering, proficiency and discipline shall not be counted for this purpose".

The Regulation for change of branch in B.Tech. programme remains unchanged.

12.2.14 To consider the draft of An Affiliation Agreement between UTD and IITR for signing.

After discussion, the Senate decided that the draft of an Affiliation Agreement between UTD and IITR as given in the agenda note be approved for signing. This will be effective from 1st June 2005.

12.3.1 To report the mode of admission to M.Tech./M. Arch./MURP Programmes based on 70% weightage to the GATE percentile and 30% to Interview/Test as approved by the ECS.

Noted with the observation that the Departments, which wish to switch over to interview in place of test, may shift to this mode of admission, in 2006.

12.3.2 To report the decision of the MHRD regarding the revision of admission/ fee structure for Foreign Students in the IITs.

Noted with the observation that the fee structure given below will be effective from the Academic Session 2005-2006:

Full time: (a) 2000 US\$ per year for foreign students from the SAARC countries.

(b) 4000 US\$ per year for foreign students from the other countries.

Part time: (a) 50 US\$ per lecture hour per week i.e. per credit for foreign students from the SAARC countries.

(b) 100 US\$ per lecture hour per week i.e. per credit for the foreign students from the other countries.

12.3.3 To report the decision of the MHRD regarding revision of the amount for the Merit-cum-Means Scholarship.

Noted with the observation that the revised income limit/ amount of the Merit-cum-Means Scholarship etc., reproduced below, will be effective from the session 2005-2006:

The parental income limit stands revised to Rs. 2.0 lakhs per annum; the Merit-cum-Means scholarship amount stands enhanced to Rs. 1000/- per month; and the pocket allowance for the SC/ST students stands raised to Rs. 250/- per month.

12.3.4 To report the allocation of seats to different categories of students in various undergraduate programmes at IIT Roorkee

The allocation of the number of seats to different categories of students in the following undergraduate programmes at IIT Roorkee be noted. This will be included in the JEE Counselling Brochure for 2005.
